Work Under Way on Crowdy Scheme

As you may be aware, construction work for the Crowdy Head Sewerage Scheme is under way. The scheme will service the 76 existing properties at Crowdy Head, MidCoast Water's general manager Neil Hanington said.

The new scheme will see the collection of sewage from Crowdy Head and its transfer to the Harrington Sewerage Treatment Plant. This will see the end of on-site septic systems at Crowdy Head, which have presented ongoing health and environmental issues.

Construction of gravity reticulation and two pump stations at Crowdy Head form part of the scheme, along with a 9.1 kilometre rising main connecting Crowdy Head with the Harrington Sewerage Treatment Plant. The gravity reticulation system is now 40% complete and work has started on the rising main. The sewerage pump station near Stewart St has been constructed and is ready to be fitted out.

Mr Hanington said MidCoast Water will work with CoastCare for the benefit of the community.

"CoastCare have agreed to take any large rocks we may excavate as we undertake the construction of the scheme. They are planning to use them to define walking trails around the Crowdy headland."

Construction on the gravity system will recommence on 19 January 2009. Work on the rising main along Crowdy Head Rd is likely to recommence the following week. The target completion date for the overall project is June 2009.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

**CHERRY CLAFOUTIS (clafotee)
DESSERT BATTER PUDDING
Serve with
THICKENED CREAM or ICE CREAM**

Ingredients

- 500 g Fresh cherries (or use 1 x 800 g can pitted cherries, well drained)
- 60 g (1/2 cup) plain flour.
- 90 g (1/3 cup) sugar
- 4 eggs lightly beaten
- 1 cup milk
- 25 g butter melted
- Icing sugar for dusting

Method

Preheat oven to moderate 180c. Brush a 23 cm glass or ceramic pie plate with melted butter. Pit cherries and spread into dish in a single layer. Sift flour into a bowl add sugar make a well in centre. Combine eggs milk and melted butter and gradually add to flour, whisking well to remove any lumps until you have a smooth batter. Pour batter over cherries and bake 30 to 35 mins. or until the batter has risen and turned golden. Dust with icing sugar and serve warm with thickened cream.

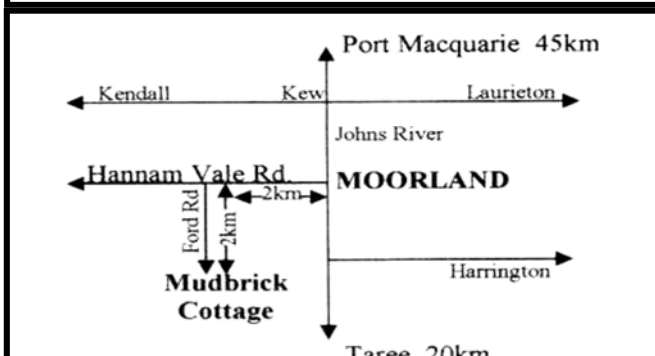
