Government Extends Concession Travel To Regional Areas.

After much lobbying by regional groups not the least being Harrington's Own Community Action Group, the State Government has introduced concession travel to regional areas utilising the private bus companies who service regional areas.

Along with the Regional Excursion Daily (Red) Ticket Scheme concession card holders will also be able to travel to Queensland and Victoria using their Rail Travel passes.

The Red Ticket Scheme will allow Pensioner Concession Card Holders, NSW Seniors or War Widows to utilise existing services to travel within the prescribed area for \$2.50 per day.

Harrington Residents can not only use the Harrington to Taree run but can also link with the Taree Forster Service and return later the same day on the afternoon school bus from Taree to Harrington using the one \$2.50 Ticket.

While Bus Timetables make it possible to travel from Harrington To Forster and return on the same day, travel to Port Macquarie and Kempsey is another story.

As there are two bus companies and 3 buses involved in the trip to Port and Kempsey (Eggin's and Busways) their existing timetables are such that an overnight stay in Kempsey may be necessary.

It is suggested people should contact the bus companies to access timetables and their travel needs.

Should there be any problems as to their requirements they should write to the bus company and send a copy of their representations to our local State Member Mr. Peter Besseling MP, at Port Macquarie, and the Greater Taree City Council, with the view to rectifying the availability of affordable public transport for the people of our towns.

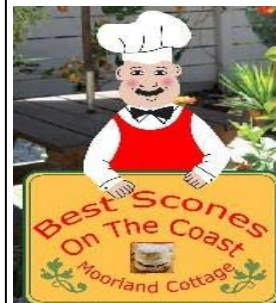

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Beef Stroganoff Roll

Course: Main. Serves : 4 Goes With: Salad or Vegies

Ingredients:

- 500g **Heart Smart** minced steak.
- 1 Pkt Beef Stroganoff Sauce mix
- 2tbsp finely chopped capsicum 1/4 cup tomato sauce 1 egg
- 1 Tbsp dried parsley flakes 1 Tbsp dried chopped chives
- 1 cup cottage cheese

Method:

Combine meat, sauce mix, capsicum, tomato sauce and lightly beaten egg, mix well Press mixture out flat into an ob-long shape on a sheet of plastic wrap.

Combine parsley, chives and cottage cheese and spread over meat mixture.

Do not take cheese mixture completely to outer edges of meat.

Roll meat as for Swiss roll using plastic wrap to help rolling.

Place meat roll into a Pyrex baking dish (seam down)

Microwave on FULL POWER/HIGH = 100% for 15 minutes

Cook for an additional 6 minutes on a lower heat.

You can also use flavoured cottage cheese such as Spring Vegetable or Pineapple

Serve hot or cold

If using double mixture form into a horseshoe shape and cook for 25 Mins. **Microwave times are for 600watt oven**

What's Biting

Summertime is flathead time & plenty of good fish are being caught in the main river and backwater, 3 of the elusive tagged flathead have been captured all within a small area between the bait shop and Vinegar Creek, fishing the Beach Street foreshore is definitely you're best chance at scoring a prize. Soft plastic lures in the 3-5 inch, size are working well as are natural baits such as whitebait and small pilchards.

The recent king tides have given Crowdy Beach a hammering with waves rushing up into the dunes, this has made 4WDing a bit more difficult and a definite impossibility on the rising tide. Anglers fishing the smaller evening tides have reported excellent catches of tailor from around Abbey Creek and further North.

Boats fishing offshore of Crowdy have reported Pearl Perch to 3kg, plenty of flathead and the first of the mahi mahi and kingfish have started to show around the wave rider buoy. Early morning and afternoon sessions have produced some great snapper action for crews fishing soft plastics. There are plenty of fish in the 1 – 2 Kilo range and a few bigger specimens as well.

Tennis meeting and AGM Sunday 8th Feb 2pm, all positions declared vacant, all welcome.

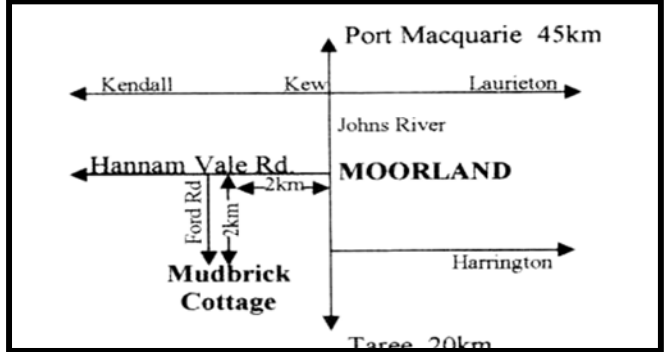
